During terms 4 and 5, EMBA-Global students choose 10 options from the EMBA-Global elective portfolio.		
The EMBA-Global elective portfolio is made up of:		
<p>1. Elective courses – EMBA-Global students have access to the elective courses of both Columbia University and London Business School. You can select a format, timeframe and location to suit you.</p> <p>2. Independent research courses – These courses give you the opportunity to work – either individually or in a team of up to four members – with a faculty member from either School on a project that challenges you to analyse and resolve complex business problems using the business skills, frameworks and tools acquired through the programme.</p> <p>3. International assignment/seminar – Both Schools offer a range of international assignment and seminar destinations, which allow you to further broaden your global perspective. Each trip has its own unique focus, but usually includes attending seminars, visiting corporate sites and meeting with top business and government leaders. A choice of locations include eastern Europe, China, South America, South Africa and India.</p>		
Core courses have been carefully planned so you can begin taking electives as early as the end of the third term. You may take all your electives at one School, thus reducing or eliminating the need to travel.
